ORDINANCE REGULATING CONDUCT WITHIN THE LIBRARY

In order to render the use of the library to the greatest benefit for the greatest number of residents and taxpayers Illinois law confers on the Board of Library Trustees the authority to:

- adopt reasonable rules and regulations (75 ILCS 5/1-3),
- impose penalties, taxes, fees or fines (75ILCS 16/1-5),
- exclude certain persons from the library (75ILCS 16/30-55.55).

The Library strives to provide an environment that is secure and comfortable, where Library patrons can use Library materials and services without being disturbed or impeded by other Library users. In using the facilities, books, materials and other property of the West Chicago Public Library District, it shall be unlawful to engage in behavior which creates minor or major disturbances or disruptions within the library.

Procedures

In the case of minor disruptions, the violating person will receive one warning. At the second offense, the patron must leave the building for the rest of the day. In case of major disturbances, the offender may be ordered to leave the building immediately. The Library staff may call the West Chicago Police Department to help enforce the Library's rules of conduct or to learn the identity of violators of these rules. In cases not specified below, the person in charge will decide appropriate actions to be taken to ensure that the Library environment is secure and comfortable for all patrons and employees.

PENALTY: Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance may be fined not to exceed \$100.00 and/or be barred from the Library and the use of its facilities for a specified period of time.

Examples of minor disturbances include but are not limited to:

1. Impeding access to any area of the Library, including entrances and exits, as well as parking in reserved parking spots, fire lanes, or other No Parking areas. Using wheeled devices (including bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, or shoes) in or on Library property for recreational rather than transportation purposes. Bringing animals other than service animals into the Library buildings or leaving animals unattended on Library property. Smoking within fifteen feet of entrances and exits.
2. Being in the Library without shirts and/or shoes. Carrying uncovered beverages in the Library building. Eating in the Library except in designated areas. Prolonged or chronic sleeping on Library premises. Misusing restrooms.

3. Conversations in tones louder than the general noise level. Audible cell phone alerts or cell phone usage in quiet study areas or that disturbs other library patrons. Audio or electronic equipment volume that disturbs others.
4. Leaving children under the age of nine unattended or without responsible supervision; and intending to use the library facility as a substitute for a child care center facility or babysitter.
5. Leaving personal belongings unattended on Library property. Being present in Library offices, lounges and other non-public areas unless accompanied by a Library staff member or through prior arrangement with Library management.
6. Attempting to sell goods or services to the public on the premises or grounds of the West Chicago Public Library District other than those approved in advance by the Library Director or his/her representative and sold for the benefit of the Library, the Friends of the Library, or the Library Foundation.
7. Soliciting donations or otherwise raising funds, political canvassing, religious proselytizing, or otherwise disturbing patrons for purposes of eliciting or influencing their opinions and associations, or promoting any causes other than those directly related and beneficial to The Library.

Examples of major disturbances include, but are not limited to:

1. Leaving children under age 14 unattended for longer than 15 minutes after closing.
2. Fighting (real or mock), theft, vandalism, disorderly conduct, including use of profanity, harassing or threatening patrons and/or employees, public indecency, destruction or misuse of any Library property or structure.
3. Being under the influence or in possession of any illicit substance, possession of firearms, weapons, look-alike weapons or other harmful substances.
4. Sharing library cards or library card barcode numbers to access the Internet or any misuse of library cards; illegal activities on the Internet; viewing obscene material or viewing sexually explicit material resulting in complaints from other patrons or staff; or any activities intended to disrupt network services or equipment.
5. Refusing to comply with directions/instructions given by Library staff, refusing to vacate the building at closing, during emergency drills or emergency evacuations.
