Last Friday, the group traveled 60 miles by van to White Pines in Oregon, Ill, for a field trip. This area created a nonschool atmosphere so the group could build trust relationships and develop better understandings of each other by thought exercises and discussion.

"I think it's a good opportunity for students to learn survival skills", says Mr. Owens. "The discussions give them a better knowledge of how to deal with problems of society and people."

This is the first year of peer counseling and Mr. Owens is the only faculty member running it. Next year he hopes to train eight freshmen at a time in this method by assigning two of the already trained members to give them 40 hours of train-

ing. When these eight are trained, they will train more groups until over the years everybody has been exposed to it, if everything follows Mr. Owens' plan. A student, however, may opt out whenever he or she wishes.
