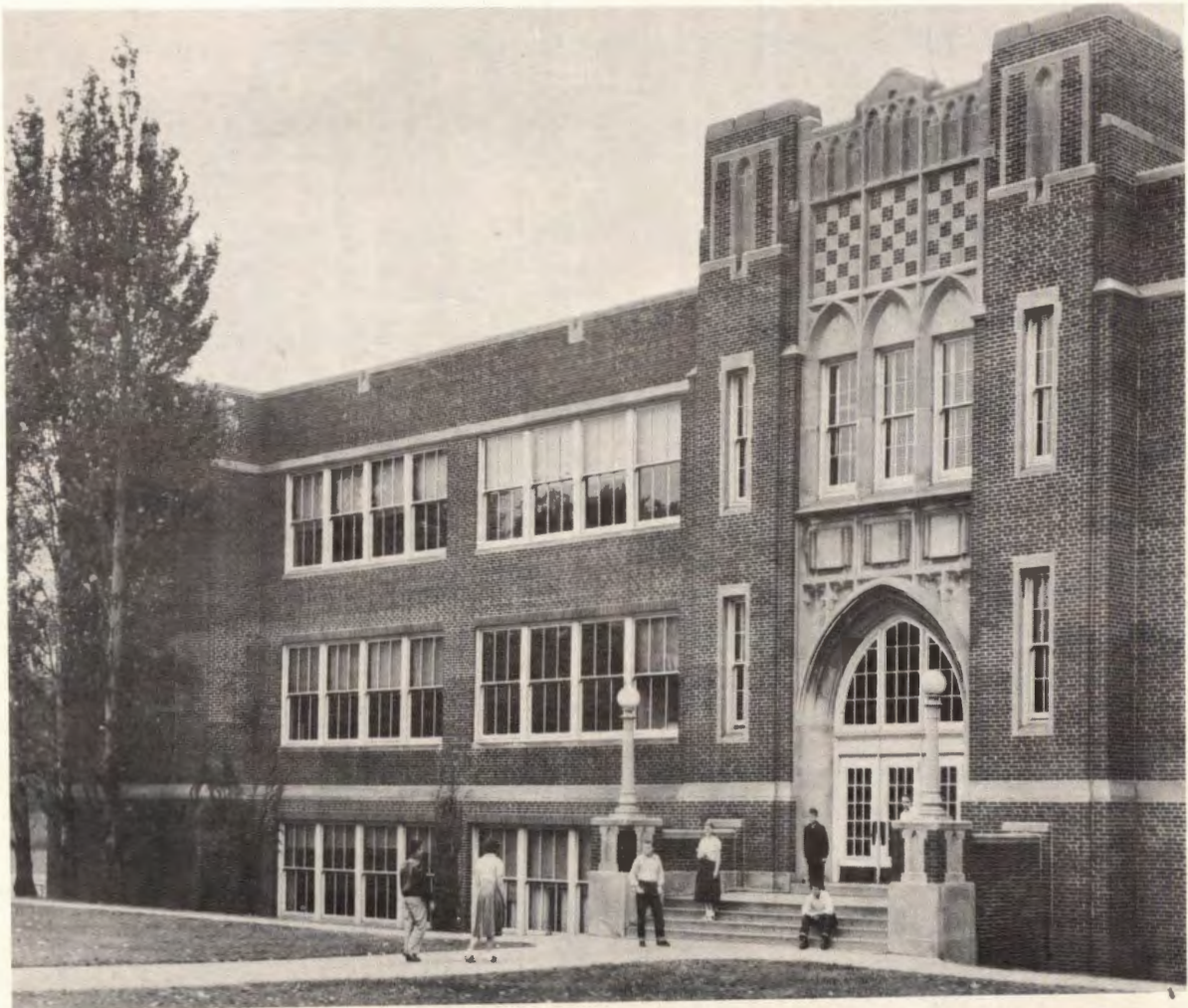

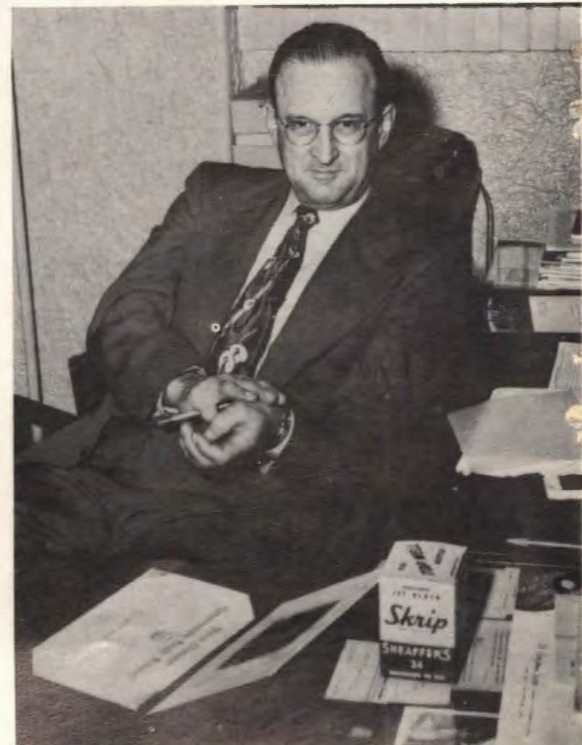
Dear Mr. Bishop,
