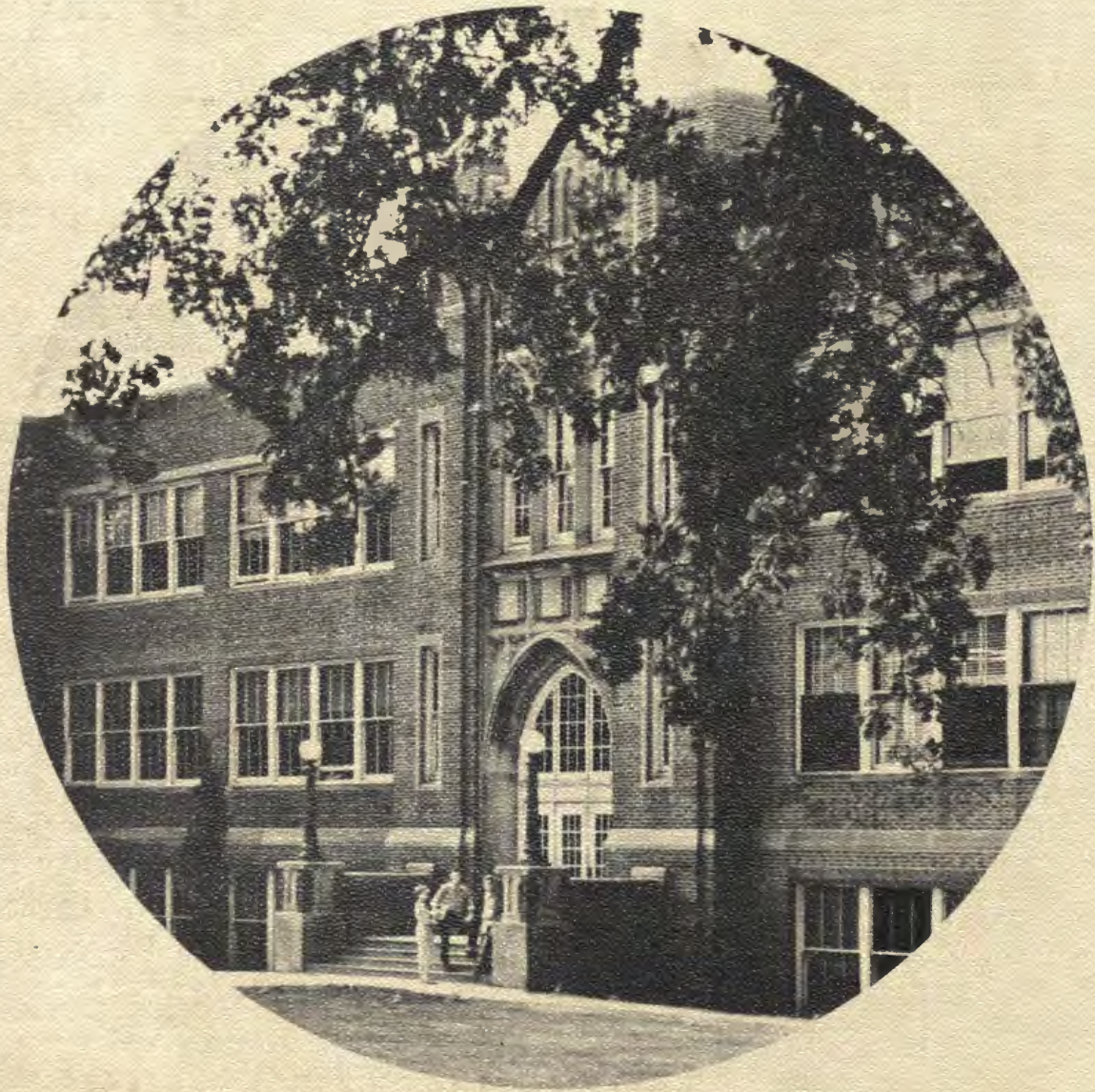


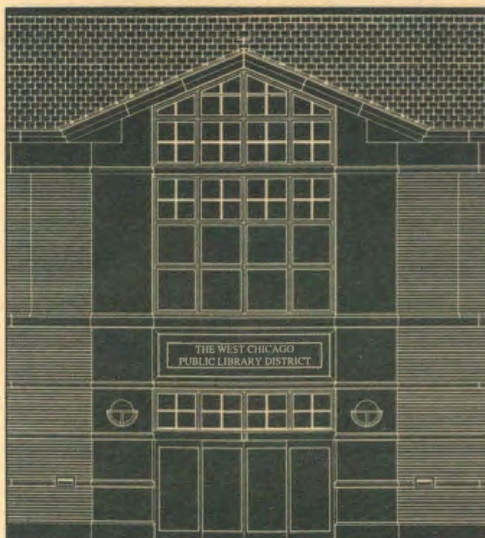

We hope you will always be as aggressive and that you will practice the same qualities of citizenship that you have shown while here.

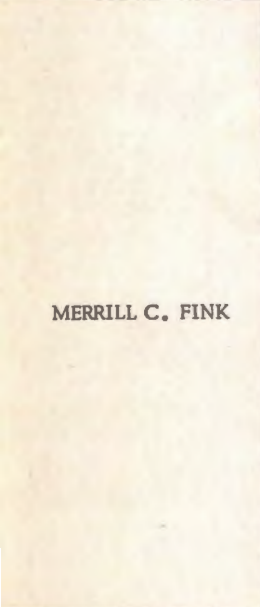
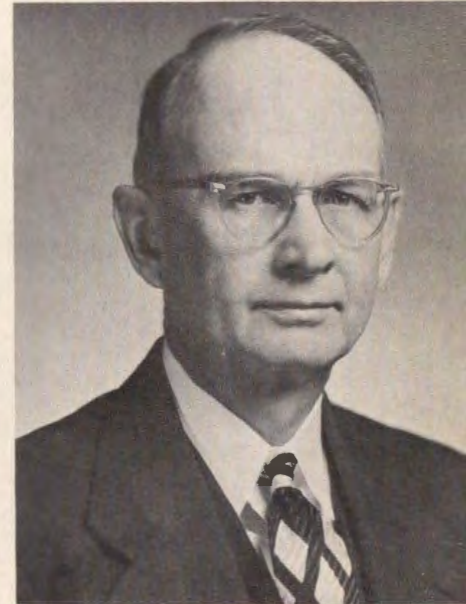
