






in contrast.








With an optimistic outlook, 1970-71 began, promising a year different from the uncertainties of school year 1969-70. Activities were restored giving students a wide range of ways in which to express themselves. Students with similiar ideas joined into numerous groups according to common interests. Still some students stood by themselves, seemingly apart from everyone else.

Changes appeared throughout the building, from new policies to new teachers to a new superintendent. Superintendent Saimon took a special interest in the school. He was often seen at school activities or talking to students for a moment or two in the hall. He displayed his athletic ability during the game against the Harlem Diplomats. At the NHS Banquet he conversed casually with students while sampling senior opinions.

This year witnessed increased experimentation in class teaching. Some faculty members searched for interesting ways to present material and others probed for new methods. Biology classes were run on a group lecture — individual experimentation basis. In many classes a trend grew toward independent learning for the individual student. The IRO program has offered students an opportunity to gain practical experience in the field of their choice. Now more classes are adopting the idea of learning through experiencing. Classes like sociology appealed to the student to make him more aware of the relevant things in our everyday world.







Present school policies strongly contrasted with those of previous years. One change was the new library policy, put into effect at the beginning of the school year by the new librarians. They limited use of the library to certain days according to study halls. Because of this action, students pushed for a return of the old library procedure and possibly a student lounge of some type. Out of this, talk-study hall grew into a realistic proposal which would offer students three alternatives for their free hours: quiet study, talk-study, or the library. Mr. Howard met with students in four class assemblies to discuss initiation of talk-study hall and reemphasized student responsibilities. With the creation of talk-study hall, students were allowed the freedom and responsibility of choice.

Last year a group of concerned parents united together for the purpose of restoring activities cut by financial difficulties. This year the Booster Club continued to contribute money for this purpose by such fund-raising events as the Harlem Diplomat Game. With the money Booster Club raised, it funded the All-School Play and the Spring Musical. New uniforms were purchased this year for the Cheerleaders and for the newly formed Pom-Pon

squad with Booster help.

Booster Club helped to give Wego students the opportunity to display their talent through outside competitions. West Chicago took first place in the State Music Contest, for which Boosters paid participation expenses. Speech was another activity restored partly through Booster Club effort. Pat Fota became the first West Chicago student to progress through the district and sectional speech contests to the state finals.




















Varsity Tried, But ...





In the Batavia vs. West Chicago game, the Cats broke a school scoring record when they scored 60 points. 

International Laugh-In






A Capella Choir Performs


I.R.O. manages football concession stands and is a member of VICA (Vocational Industrial Clubs of America) and meets monthly for a social meeting.



Cooperative Training


C.W.T. is a cooperative work training program divided into two areas. The first is a work-related class in which the student learns general skills and information needed in finding and keeping a good job. For the second part, the student is involved in actual off-campus work experience in the community. This involvement helps prepare the student to find gainful employment upon graduation.

New this year is the first contracted training program at W.C.C.H.S. It is a cooperative cosmetology class, a two year program run in coordination with the Tricosis School of Cosmetology in Elmhurst. This is designed for girls in their junior and senior years. The girls learn all aspects of cosmetology and are given the opportunity to practice these skills on customers. At the end of the senior year, a girl may become a licensed beauty operator.
















A Capella Choir Visits University of Illinois

















Varsity Takes Third Sophs Pin Championship



Dance Production this year involved both senior and junior girls. The dance class began work in September and the program was presented to the public on Valentine's Day.



This past school year we had the opportunity to play host to three foreign students. The AFS student was Fernando Teixeira from Brazil; he stayed with the James Prutzmans. The Rotary student was a girl from Greece, Pitsa Kallivokas; she stayed with the Harold Higgins. The third foreign student was Naomi Maeyoko from Japan. She spent the year in the home of her Uncle and Aunt, the Frank Watanabes.

All of them arrived here last summer and will be leaving in June for their homelands, which they all miss. They were asked whether they would remain here if given the opportunity, but the answer was "No" from all three. They each felt that they were more suited to live in their native lands. They all came here for educational purposes, but Naomi expressed her feelings more strongly than the others. She was here on her own to learn English because it has become a very important part of the Japanese education. She feels that she has benefitted greatly and that her year here will aid her when she takes her college entrance exams, which are very difficult.

When asked what they thought of our school system, their answers were all favorable; but again they felt that the system works here but it would not work in their countries. They all

expressed interest in the fact that our students are allowed to choose their courses of studies. In their own countries they are given a program which they must follow; they cannot choose as we can. They all felt that our classes are much easier than their own at home.

Fernando and Naomi said they found people to be much warmer and friendlier here than at home. Pitsa said the opposite. She felt that the people here are friendly but not as warm and open as the people of her country.

Being from different regions of the world the students each had something to say about our diet here in the U.S. None of them had ever had any kind of pies (meat or fruit or dessert). Naomi was amazed at the amount of beef that we have here and decided that hamburgers were her favorite. Pitsa had never seen or heard of sandwiches either. She said they were all right — at the right time, but she was accustomed to having fully-prepared, cooked meals, every meal. Fernando said that he too was not familiar with food in the form of pies, but he liked them anyway. Beef was nothing new to him because it is a major product of Brazil.












Harried Harriers











Golfers Look to Victory

Zero - Love




Outstanding players were the co-captains for singles, Doug Schmult and Mike Ford, and Joe Butler co-captain for doubles.


















Let's Go, You Guys!



ry. Upon returning, he came to teach at the high school. He has not always been the dean, though. His coaching brought our Frosh-Soph Football Team its first conference title. He also taught shop, driver's education, and did administrative work.

He has enjoyed the twenty-seven years he's been with us because he loves teenagers and always enjoyed teaching. As Mr. Jahns said, "The association with the students makes it all worthwhile." He feels that the students respected his job and didn't resent him personally. They just "took their lumps and came back for more!"

He realizes that there are many problems in this school. He feels the most prominent ones are truancy, smoking and vandalism. He feels it isn't that the problems have changed through the years, we just hear more about them. They are harder to solve, however. The town has grown so that he doesn't know all the students and their parents. It is difficult to contact the parents because both are often times working.

If anyone knows Mr. Jahns very well or has ever stopped to talk to him in the hall, they know that he has a delightful sense of humor. When asked whether he will miss working, he replied, "I'll miss the challenge of the day to day, but not the other part!"

Besides teaching and being Dean, Mr. Jahns has been very active as a citizen. Here in West Chicago he has been involved in the Boy Scouts, Community Fund, and the West Chicago Indians, a baseball team. (He also played semi pro basketball with the Elburn Collegians.) He is a man with hobbies, memories, ideas and hopes. He enjoys fishing, hunting, lapidary work and all kinds of shopwork. After his retirement, he has no special plans. He would just like to take it easy and "play it by ear." He has hopes of traveling, vacationing at his cabin in Michigan, visiting his children, and working at his own leisure. He is looking forward to being able to get up and go anywhere, whenever he wants to. In a year, he has expectations of a trip to Alaska — driving up through Washington and Canada, coming back on a scenic boat trip through the glaciers in the Pacific Ocean.

He has many wonderful memories to take with him and cherish. Our school has been a big part of his life and he will not forget it, just as we will never forget him.

Prom "Remembrances"




Class of 1971 Graduates


