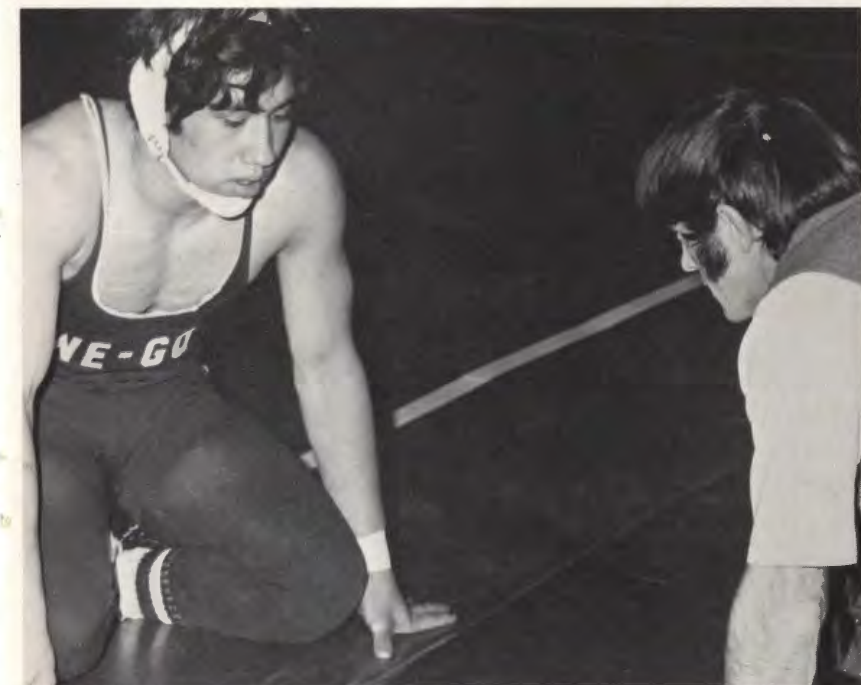


GRAPPLER POWER

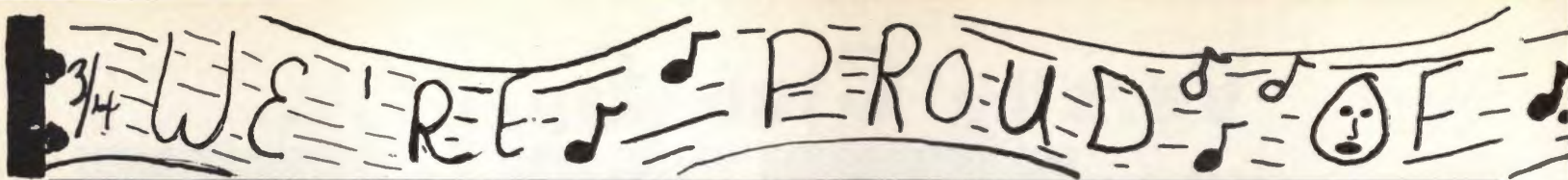
Varsity Club Spells

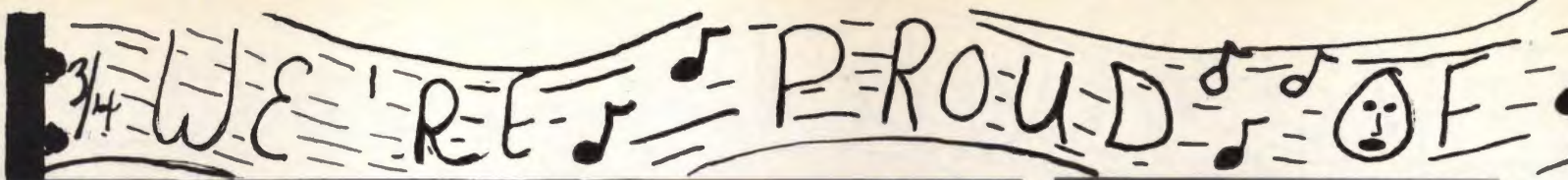

The winter months were busy and exciting. We played for

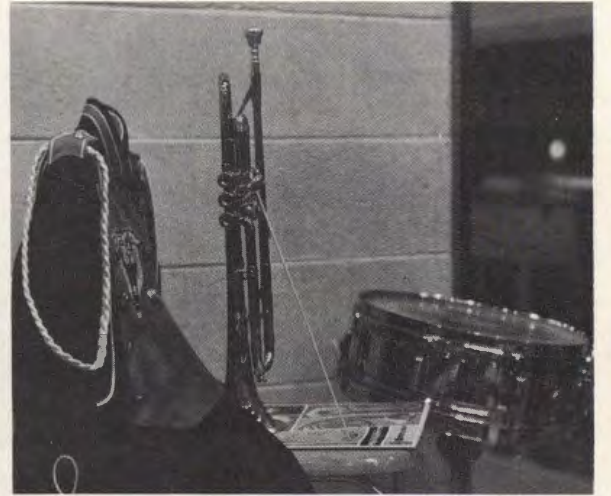
Pep Assemblies, and Basketball games, and were complimented many times for the excellence of our performances. Hopefully, music helped to keep school spirit high at We-Go last winter.

During April and May we returned to a study of all types of music, and finished a busy year with our final Spring Concert on Tuesday, May 29, 1973.



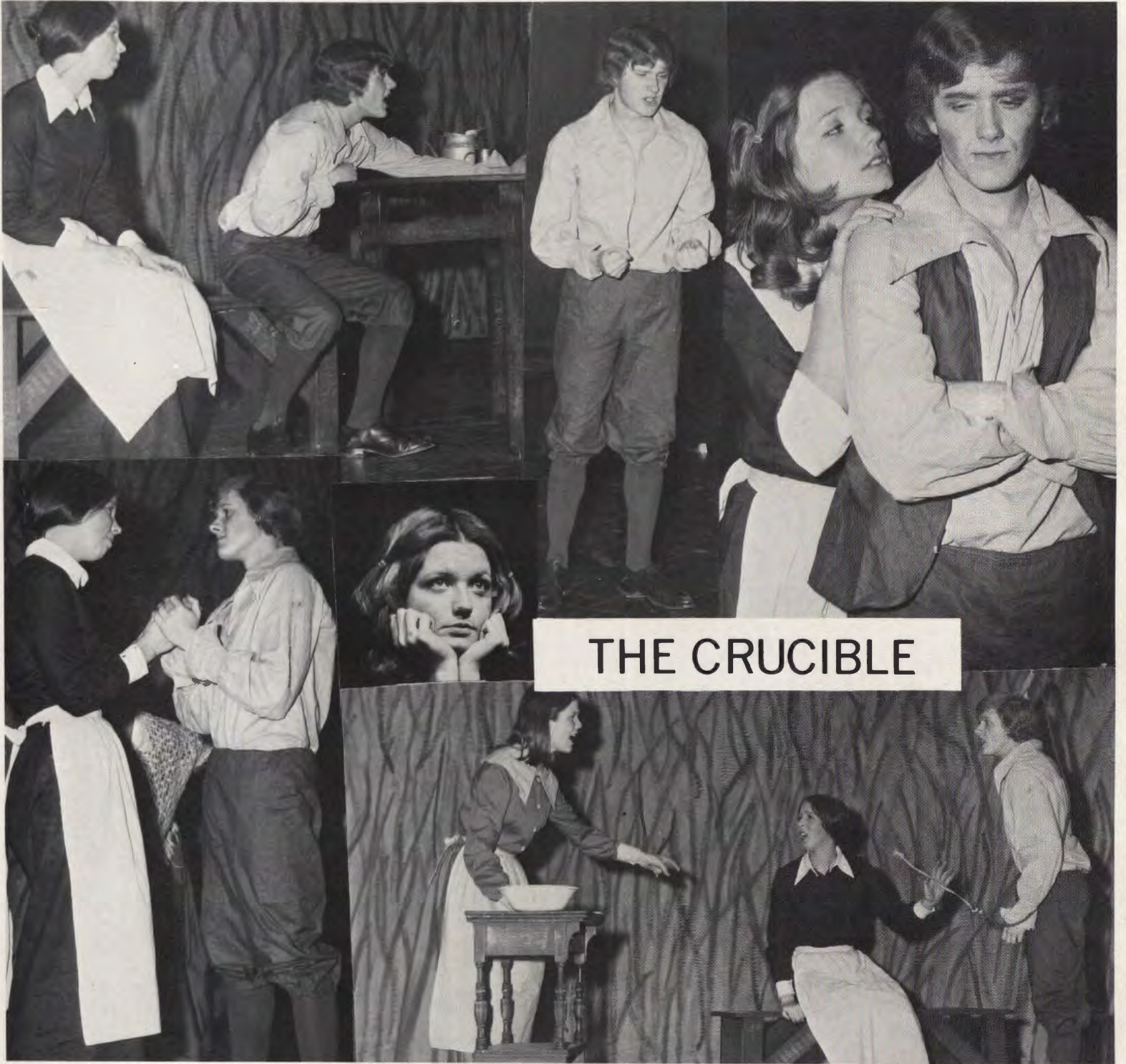
The Crucible ...

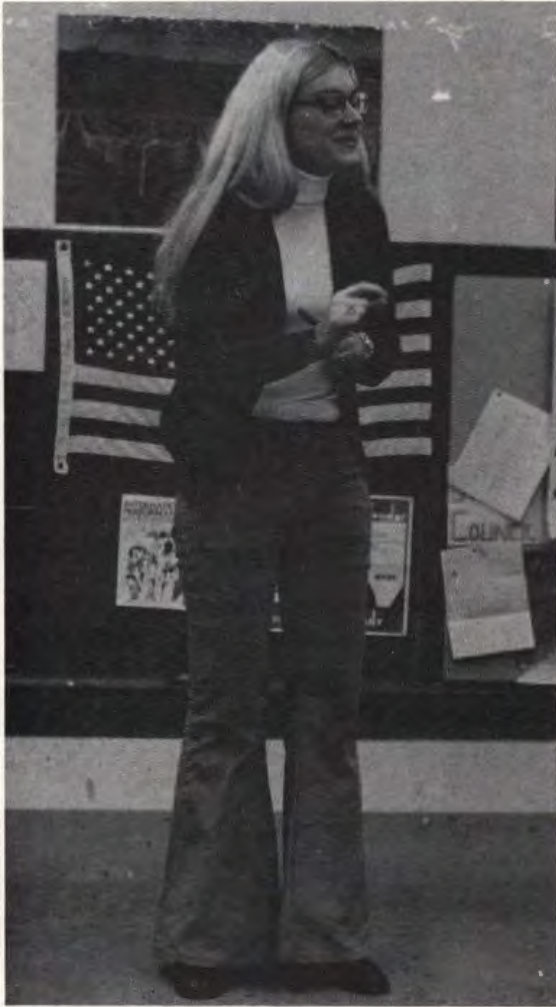
