## GRAPPLER POWER!

The varsity wrestlers started off an exciting season with the trio of Scott Dierking, Pete Dombrowski, and Wayne James going undefeated through dual meet action. Led by this year's captains Dierking, Dombrowski, and Spohn, the Wildcats posted a 15-2 season, losing only to Oswego and Naperville. Another first for Wildcat fans were two shutout victories against Kaneland (56-0), and Glenbard (60-0). They captured the first place trophy at the challenging Hinsdale Holiday Tournament. Conference tournament action saw Mike Cox, Scott Dierking, Dan Jeffery, Pete Dombrowski, and Wayne James with firsts, and winning the Little Seven Conference wrestling trophy for the second year straight.

Districts saw the Wildcats take a very close third with five individual first by Tony Cortez, Mike Cox, Scott Dierking, Pete Dombrowski, and Wayne James and a second by Dan Jeffery. At Sectionals, Tony Cortez took a fourth after losing to 145 lb . state champ Doug Chirico of Naperville.

Scott Dierking proceeded to take a first at West Leyden Sectionals and was the Wildcats line representative downstate at the University of Illinois, Chambana, where he captured a first place victory at 185 lbs., scoring the only pin in the finals ( $1: 40$ ), to defeat previously unbeaten Jerry Washington of Thorwood, for West Chicago's placing ninth in the IHSA wrestling tournament. He was cheered on by a record number of West Chicago fans who attended the tournament and celebrated the victory afterwards.

The "Most Valuable Wrestler" award went to Scott Dierking, and the "Most Improved" was Wayne James. Tri-captains for next year are Tony Cortez, Tom Truitt, and Pete Norman.
