"Rocky" was at the movies, and "Roots" on TV. Coffee prices went up, and thermostats went down. January brought a record number of days below zero, and May, a record number over ninety. As the bicentennial year ended, the democratic process was still functioning; Jimmy Carter defeated Gerald R. Ford for the Presidency.

An important vote for the school occurred on Saturday, November 13, when voters in School District 94 approved a \$5.3 million building bond issue to build new learning resource center, commons, cafeteria, and student service offices on the south and field house, swimming pool, and greenhouse on the north. Also included are extensive renovations in the old section. In the spring trees on the south were moved, and house movers rolled away two houses on the north, entertaining student spectators in the process. Ground was broken in July, ending one era in the history of the school and beginning another.
