Mr. Henry Howard joined the West Chicago faculty in the fall of 1945 as the one instructor of the entire music program in the high school and elementary system. In 1947 with the increasing interest in school music, a vocal instructor was hired. Mr. Howard continued exclusively in the field of instrumental training. It was during this time that tonettes, pre-instruments for grade school students, were introduced under his direction.

On Thursday, March 18, 1954, the West Chicago Chamber of Commerce awarded Mr. Howard a plaque paying tribute to him for his "Contribution to the Community of West Chicago". This was the first such award ever made to a West Chicago citizen and was awarded to him not only for his services of that year but for his community spirit and untiring work ever since he arrived in West Chicago.


Mr. Howard directed the high school band from 1945-1956, and fielded one of the first marching bands in the Little Seven Conference. In the fall of 1956 he undertook the responsibility of the high school orchestra. Encouraging students to take part in solo and ensemble performances, Mr. Howard created the We-Go-Ego Club and is one of the founders of the many ensemble clinics and festivals in this area.

Hours upon hours of his time have been devoted in helping those students who plan on a career in music. It can be seen that his real interest and concern lie not in grinding out musical techniques but in the value of music to the student. Through the guidance and direction of this wonderful gentleman, the music department has become one of the finest. The thousands of students who have received instruction from Mr. Howard should feel greatly honored. The *Challenge* staff extends a very warm "Thank You", Mr. Howard, and may your future be as marvelous and full as your past.

for the Prom held on May 22, 1965, at the Baker Hotel in Saint Charles, Illinois. The Prom theme was "Misty Moonlight," which was carried through by a song of the same title especially written for the occasion.

For weeks before the election in April of 1965 there had been rallies and debates, and every available inch of wall space in the school was covered with posters. The Class of 1966 was also responsible for the Homecoming dance in partnership with the Juniors, and we presented the excellent "Que Sera Sera". The Homecoming Queen, elected from the Senior class, was Dorothy Dempsey. Our Christmas Dance was entitled, "Le Petite Noel".

Now these four years have come to a close. They were happy, beautiful, and prosperous years, years that have given us great progress in our education as well as some lasting friendships. May our progress and friendships continue on and on throughout our lives.

A new technique for teaching general math students has been developed. Under the direction of Mr. Murphy, nine senior boys, all advanced in math, have a class of their own. The theory that students communicating with students could be more effective is the basis for this new program.

Two semester courses in statistics have also become part of the school curriculum. The first semester, descriptive statistics, deals with the methods of collecting, organizing and preparing the results of sampling for future use. The second semester, inferential statistics, is concerned with analyzing and drawing conclusions from the gathered information.

The remaining portion of the math department is comprised of classes in algebra, geometry, trigonometry and math IV.







The purpose of this program is to introduce the Lion's boys to the leaders of our community and to acquaint them with the needs of our locality and how to face them.






FROSH-SOPH FOOTBALL 1965




Using a fast break and a pressing defense, the Freshman Basketball team literally "ran" to its record of 15-8.
