Forty-four players were awarded letters this year.

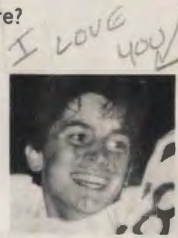

Although the team had a disappointing record, enthusiasm remained high throughout the season.



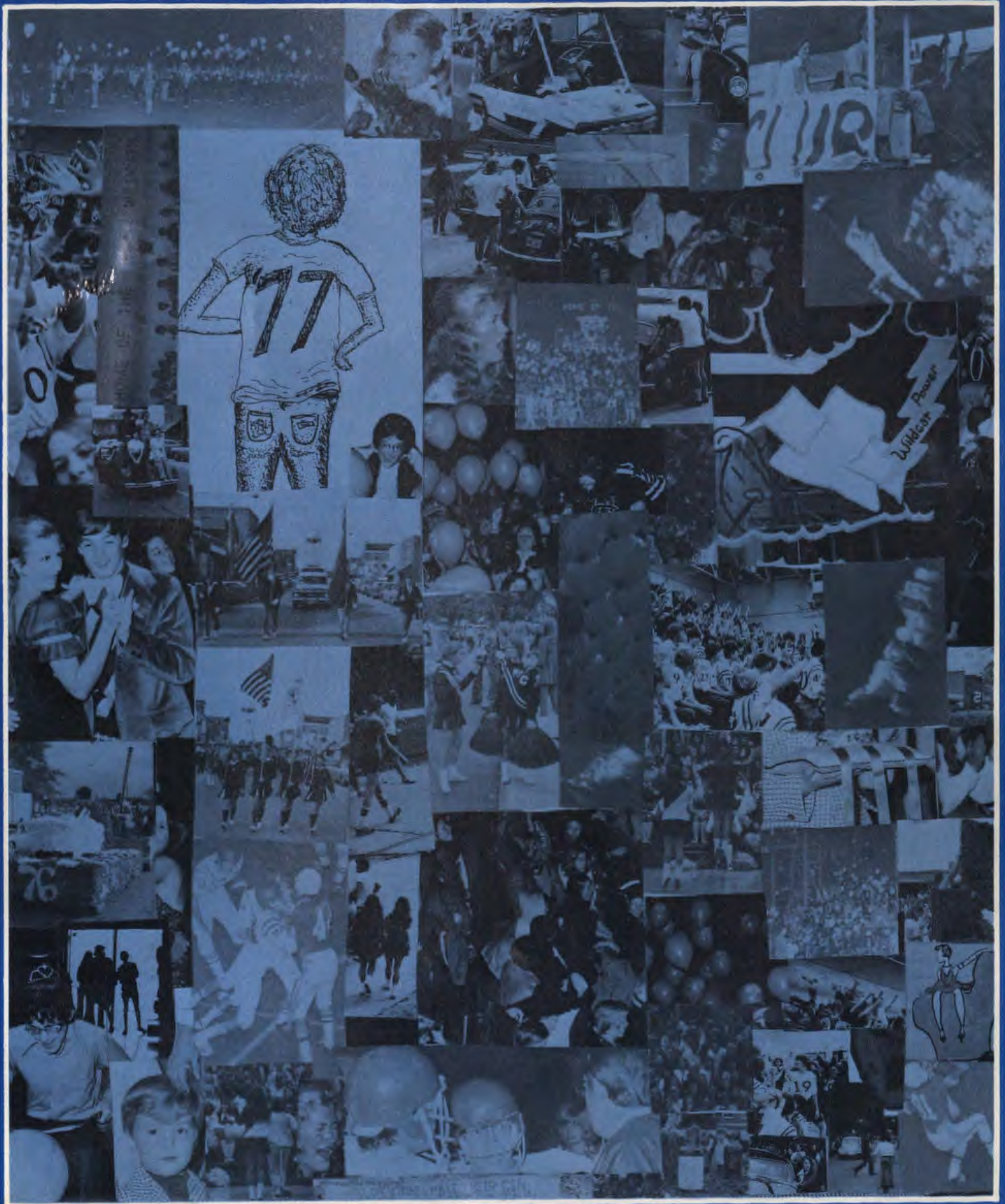

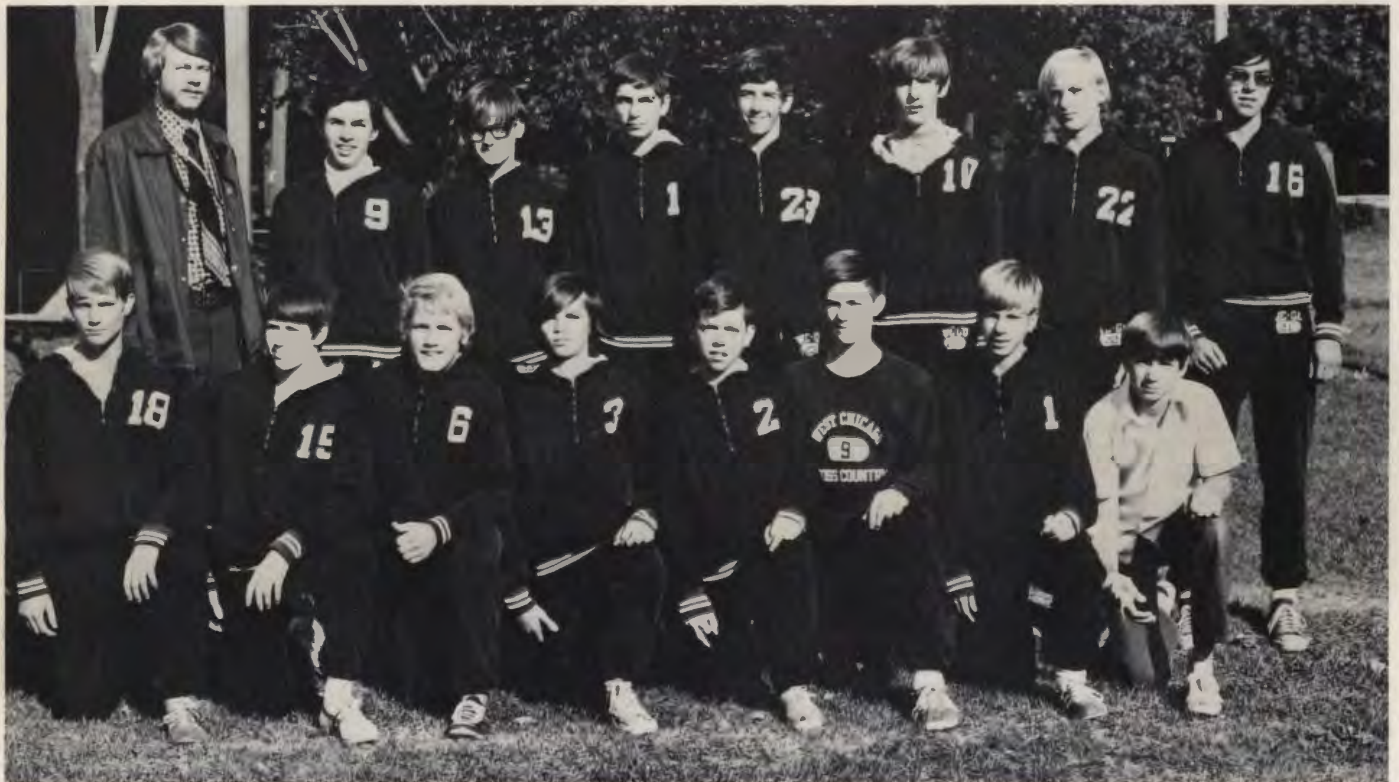

CATS TAKE CONFERENCE

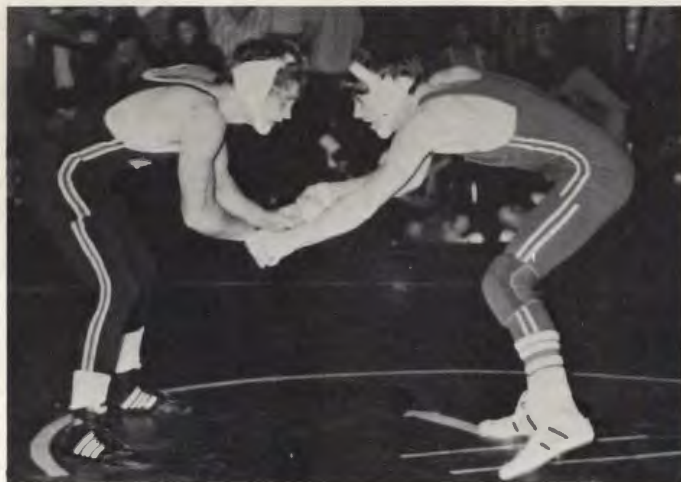

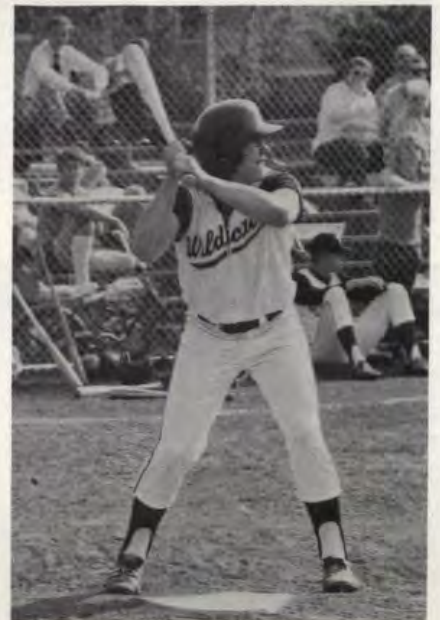
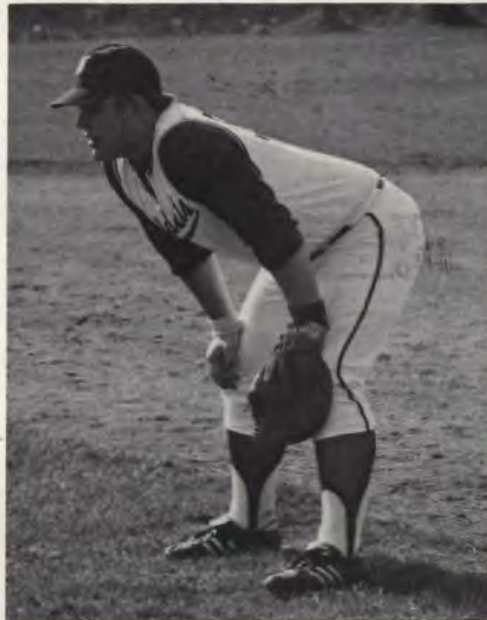
SPRING
