Coaches Gil DeMay, Gary Lunak and Jeff Ainsworth led the sophomore Wildkits through a good season.


Forty-four players were awarded letters this year.

The Wildkits ended their 1973 football season with a 2-6-1 record. They finished seventh in the conference.





Although the team had a disappointing record, enthusiasm remained high throughout the season.















Alfaro — conference champion and second at Naperville. Andy Cox and Jon Minter both took second in conference.

A total team effort throughout the year enabled the grapplers to have a very successful year.


The freshman team had a record of 6-3-1. They placed fourth in the DeKalb Tournament and fourth in the Batavia Tournament.














FRESHMAN CHORUS


SPRING


District Tournament in the State Championship series.





The Paul Fredericksons were Maria's host family. She felt students here are very independent and self-confident.






GRADUATION
