RIGHT: Southside School, Wood Street, built in 1887 when population of town reached 1500, included grades 1-10. In 1904 a high school district was formed. This building was used by both elementary and high school students until 1908. (See top of next page.)



ABOVE: The core of the present school was built on Joliet Street in 1926. At that time enrollment was about 125 students. The stage also served as the gymnasium, which accounts for its large size.
ABOVE LEFT: An addition in 1955, when enrollment was 417, included a cafeteria (now replaced) at southwest area of building, as well as industrial arts wing, small gymnasium, PE locker rooms, gymnastics gym, and classrooms at northwest and southwest corners.





LEFT: In 1908 high school students went to the newly constructed Washington School at corner of Fremont and McConnel Streets. This building replaced former Northside School, built in 1873 and razed in 1908. (Washington School was torn down in 1969, but the concrete eagle above the door remains on the site, location of present Fire Department.) High school students went here until 1927 when core of present building on Joliet Street was completed.



In 1965, when school enrollment had reached 1025, Bishop Gymnasium and the north wing, containing science, social studies, and foreign language classrooms, was added. In 1978-79, with enrollment at 1583, the school was enlarged again. On the north the fieldhouse, pool, and greenhouse were constructed; on the south, new learning resource center, cafeteria, commons, and offices. Seventeen classrooms were formed in areas vacated by former LRC and offices

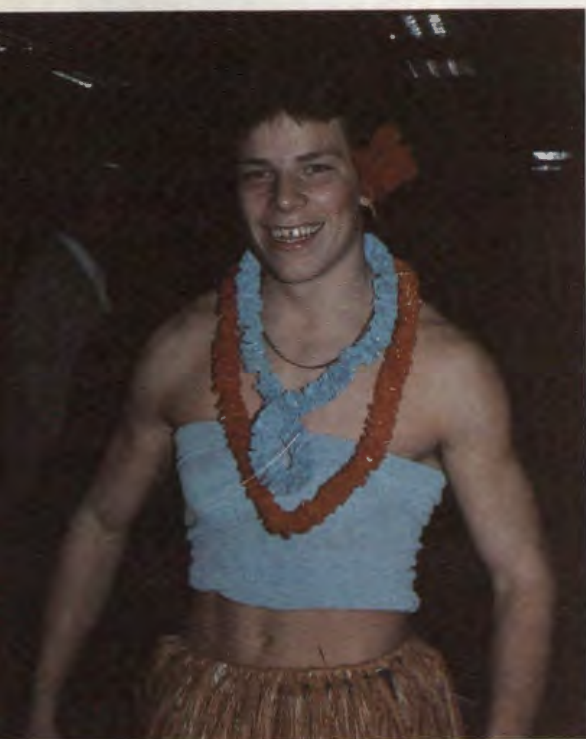

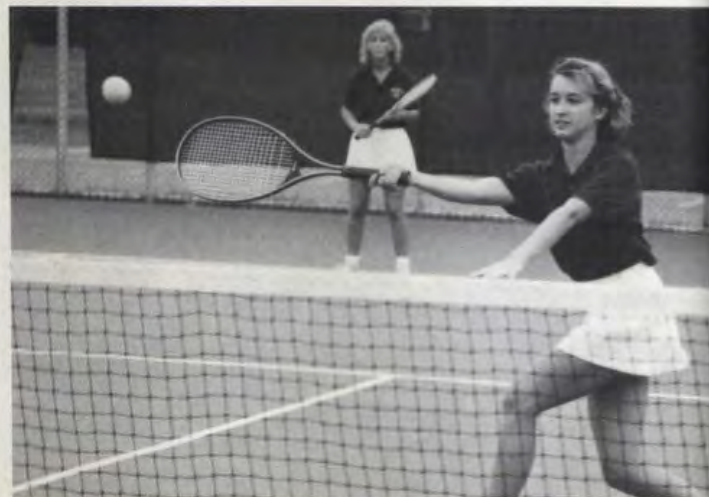
Lach And Turner Advance To State

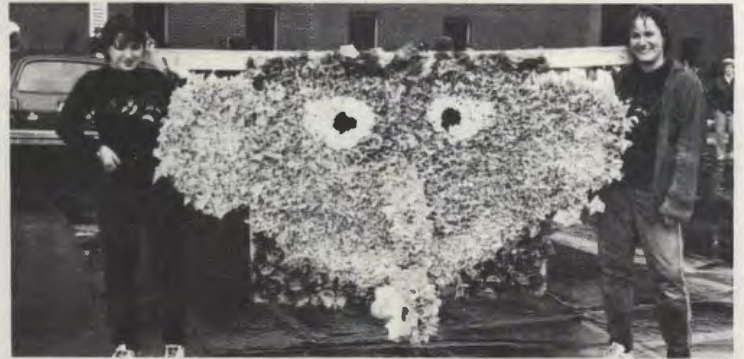

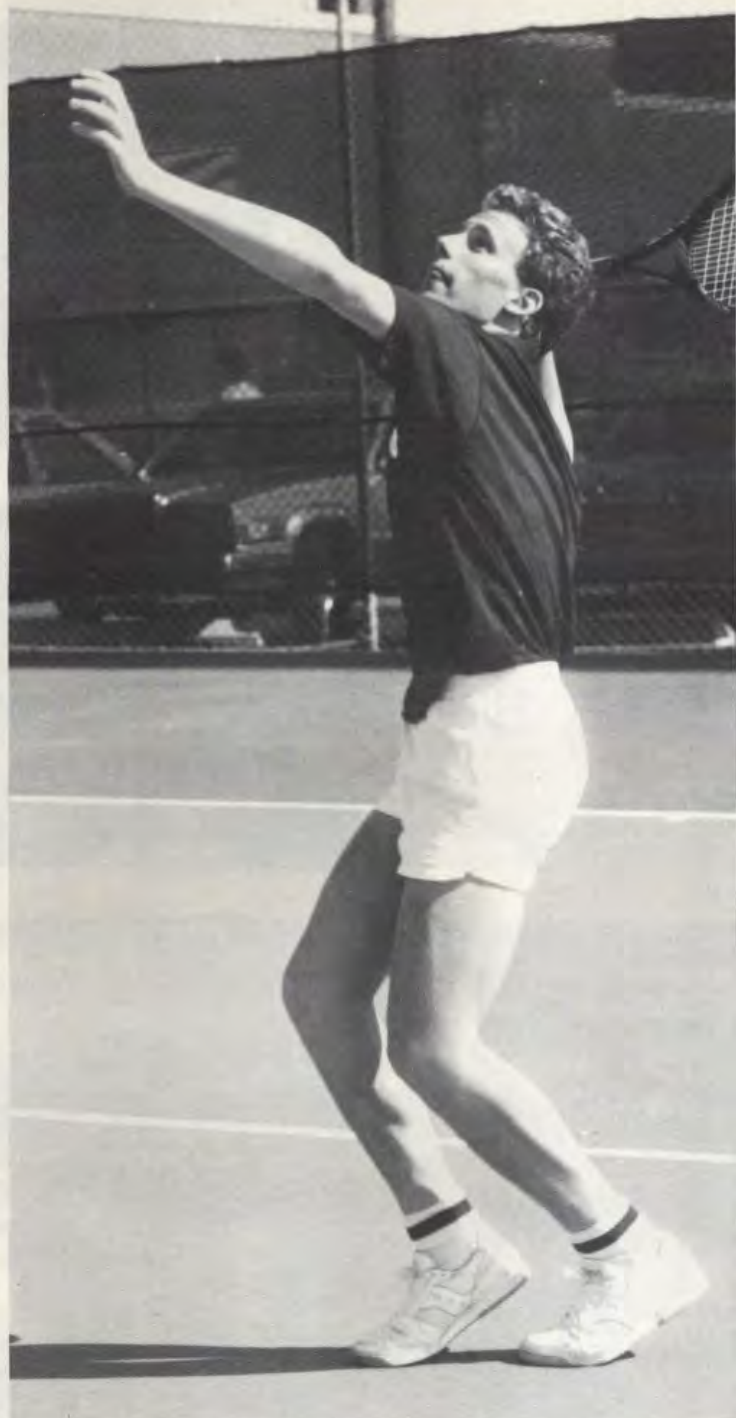

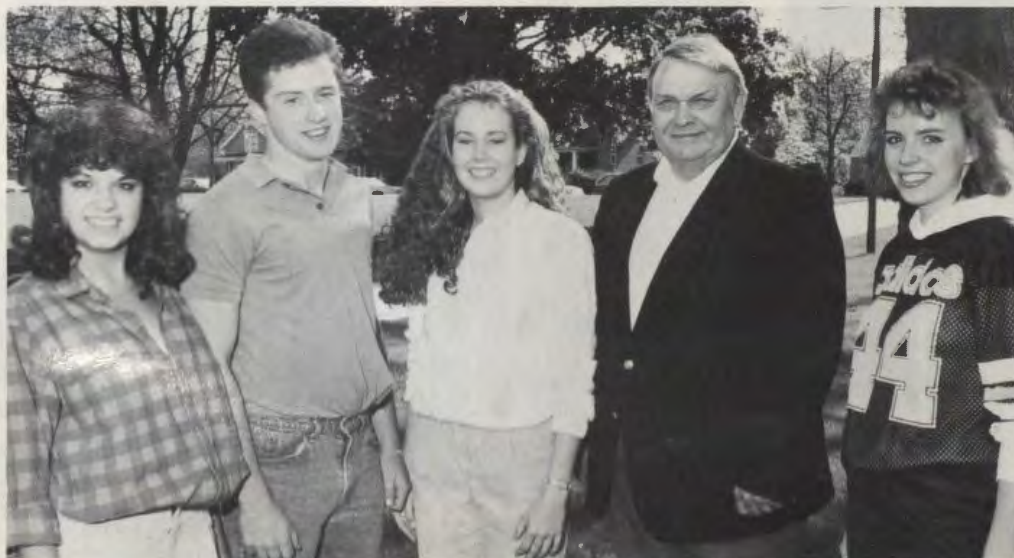
