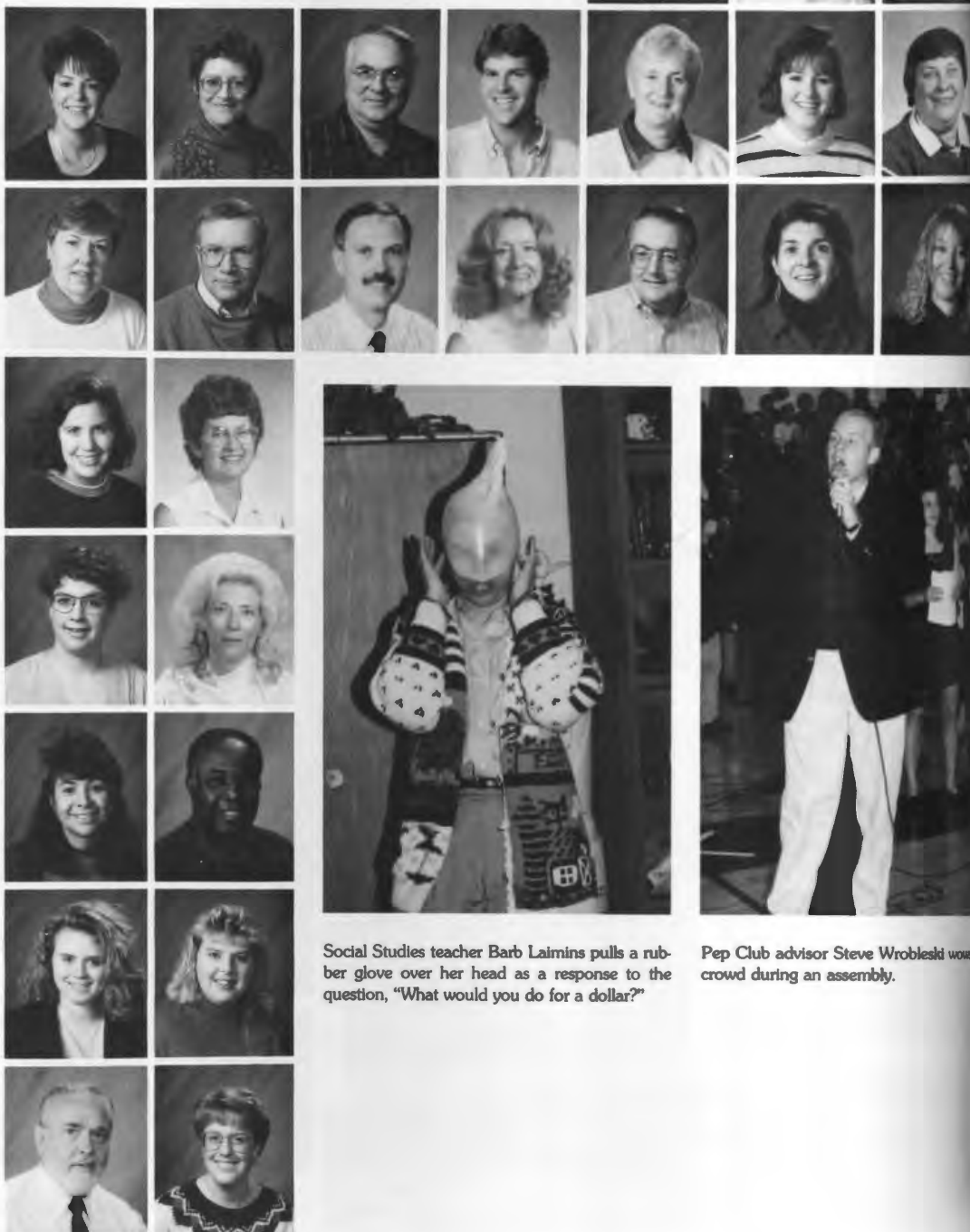

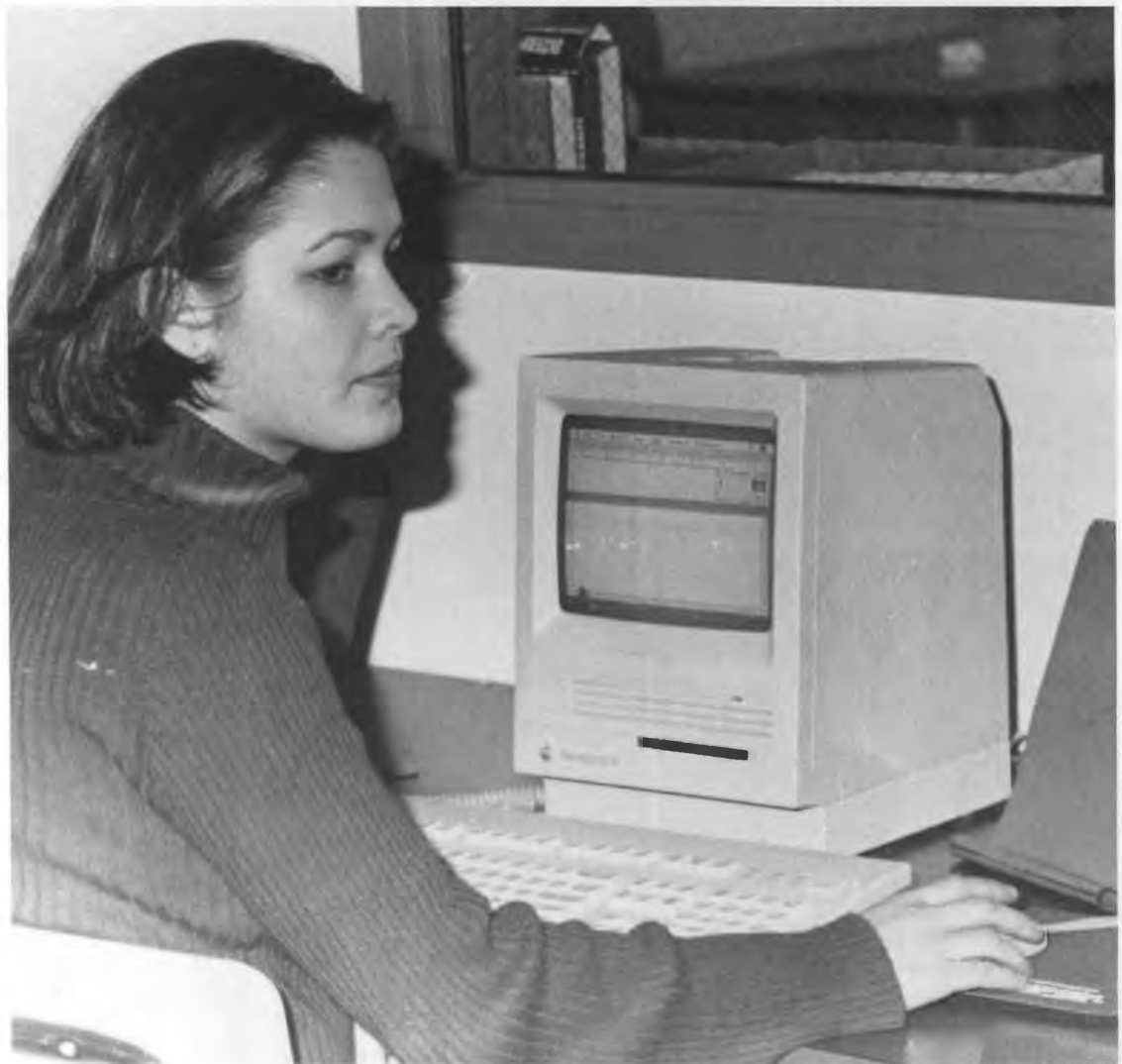

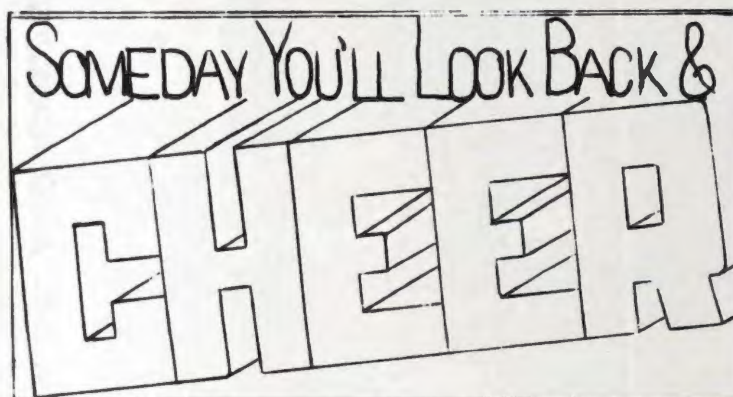

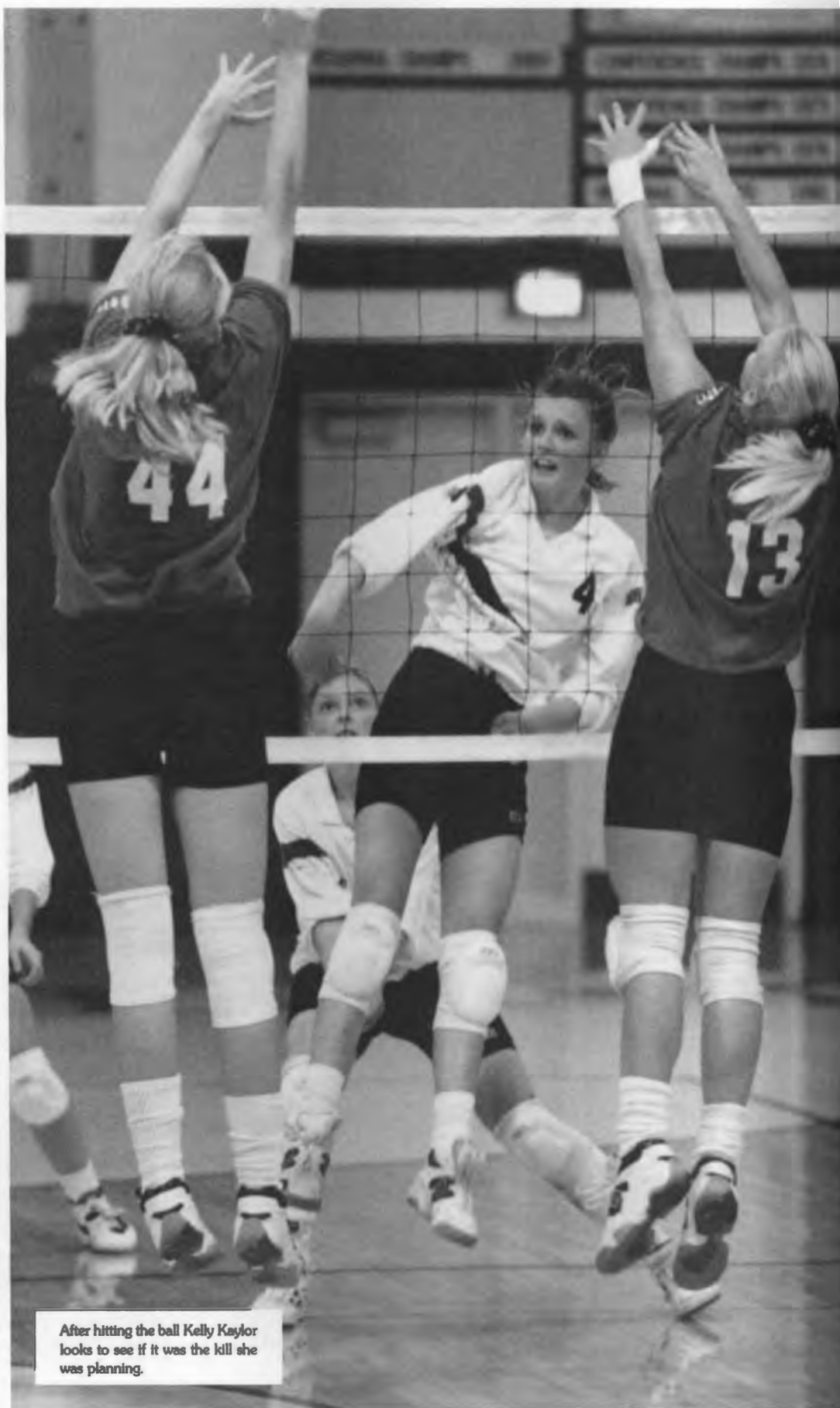

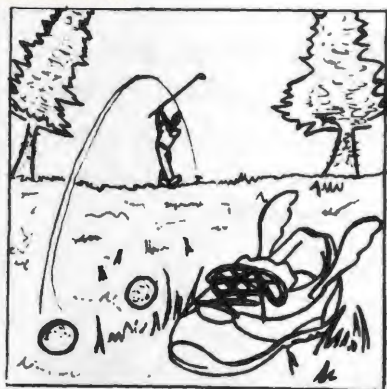

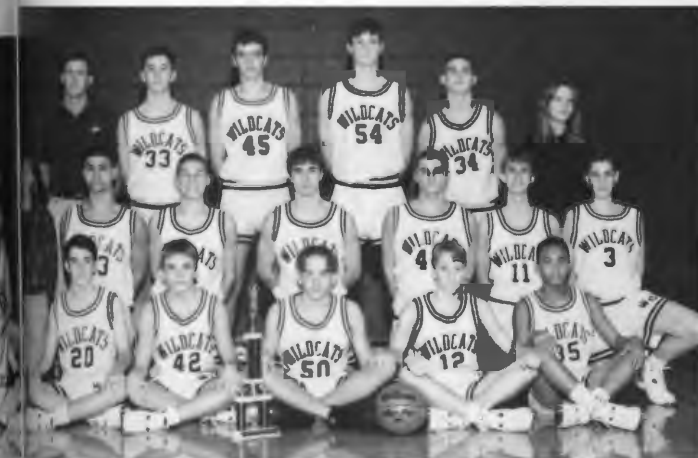
Boys Net Tough Season

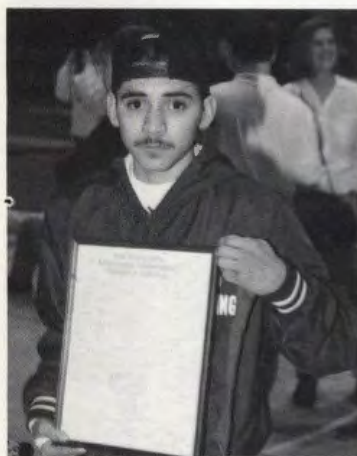

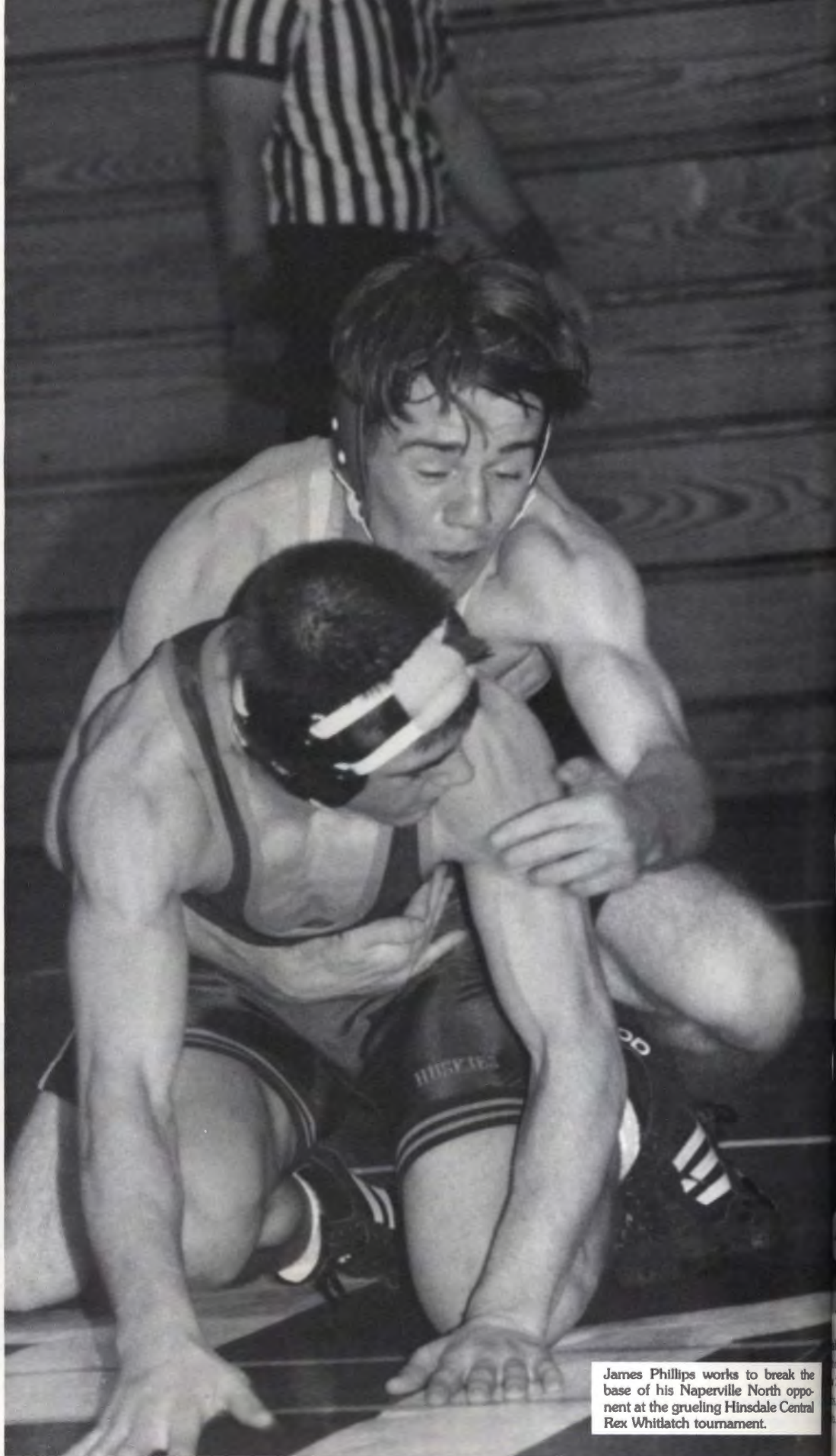

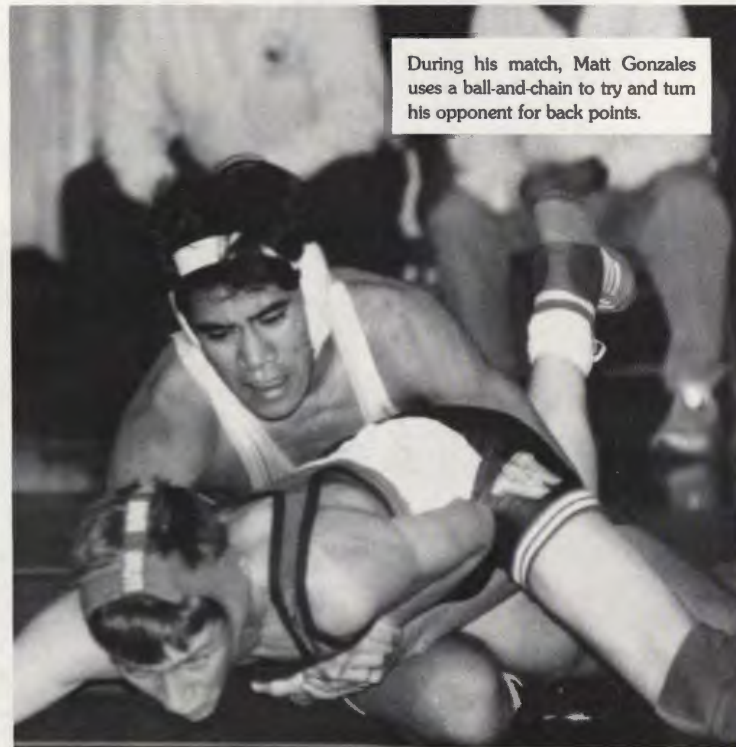

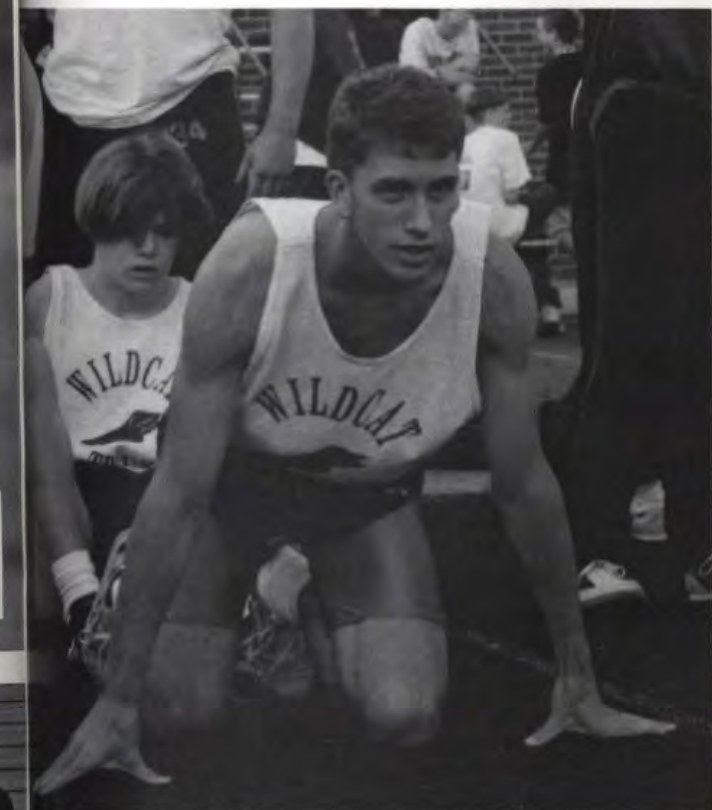

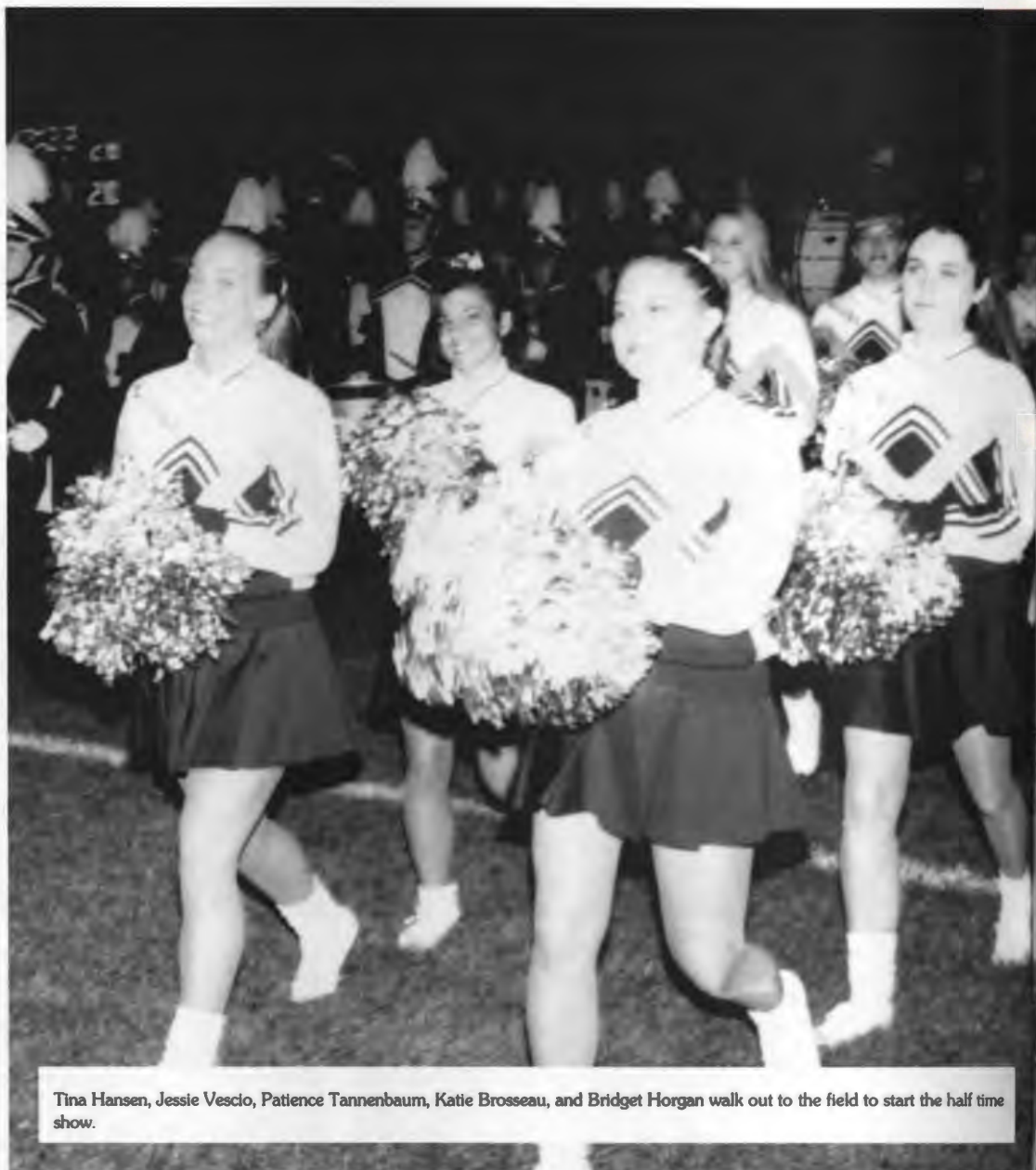

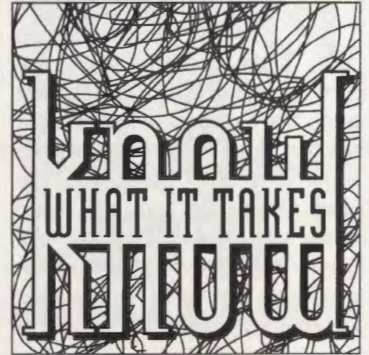

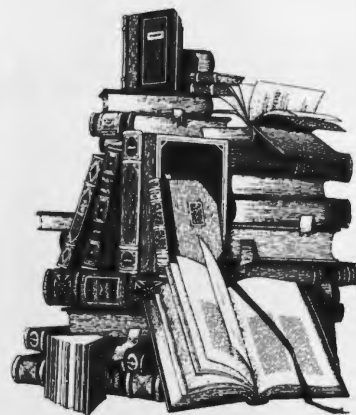
